November in the Garden

GARDEN JOBS

- Prepare your patch! Dig in manure to garden beds & mulch
- Sow flower seeds - ageratum, cosmos, cornflower, nigella, poppy, nemisia, rudbeckia & geum
- Fertilise fruit trees

SEEDS TO PLANT

Asian greens (Pak Choy, tatsoi, mizuna), beans (climbing), beetroot, cucumbers, dill, leeks, lettuce, onions, peas, pumpkins, spring onions, tomatoes (in the greenhouse) zucchini

SEEDLINGS TO PLANT

Asian greens, leeks, lettuce, onions, silverbeet, spinach, spring onions, chives, marjoram, mint, oregano, parsley, rosemary, sage, tarragon, Vietnamese mint.

PESKY PESTS

White Cabbage Moth

- Deter with dummy butterflies or fine netting

Aphids

- A spray with the hose should knock these little nasties off the plant or a soapy spray. Avoid over fertilising plants as this makes them more desirable for aphids.



December in the Garden

GARDEN JOBS

- Watering - before 10am or after 4pm. Give the fruit trees a good soak twice a week. Plants in pots & green veggies will require daily watering and others every second day
- Cover lettuce & leafy greens on hot sunny days with a shade cloth
- Check the zucchinis and pumpkins early every morning. Assist with fertilisation if bees are in short supply.
- Continue to tie up the tomatoes as they grow to protect them from the strong winds.



SEEDS TO PLANT

Lettuce (hot weather varieties such as Cos, Oakleaf & Tango), spring onions

SEEDLINGS TO PLANT

Cucumber, lettuce (Cos), spring onions, sweetcorn, zucchini, basil, Thai basil

PESKY PESTS

Aphids

- Aphids thrive in hot dry weather and seem to appear overnight. They do have several predators such as ladybirds and soldier beetles so it is highly possible that they will disappear just as quickly.

Libraries accepting donations:


Ocean Grove: 9:00-10:30am
